OPERATION MAHADEV IN J&K

On July 28, security forces launched Operation Mahadev, eliminating key TRF terrorists behind the Pahalgam attack. The operation drew global attention after the U.S. designated TRF as a terrorist outfit.

BHARAT BANDH – JULY 9 STRIKE

Over 25 crore workers joined the Bharat Bandh on July 9, disrupting banking, coal, transport, and postal services. The strike was one of the largest organized protests in recent years.



NEERAJ CHOPRA CLASSIC LAUNCHED

India hosted its first Gold-label javelin event on July 5 in Bengaluru, led by Olympic champion Neeraj Chopra. He won gold with an 86.18 m throw against global athletes.

INDUSTRIAL OUTPUT GROWTH

India's industrial output grew 3.5% year-on-year in July, the highest in four months. Manufacturing surged by 5.4%, while mining and electricity showed mixed trends.



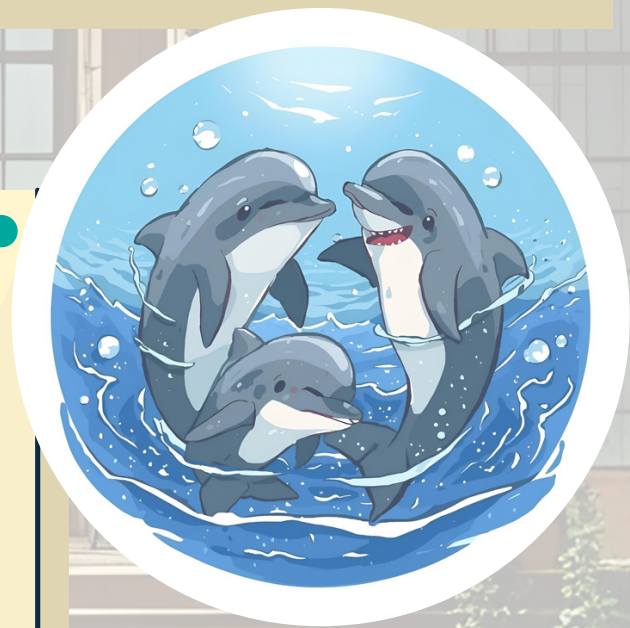
CHINA'S MEGA-DAM SPARKS CONCERNS

A group of 25 students from the 1st Year BBA LL.B. (H) programme took part in this educational visit.

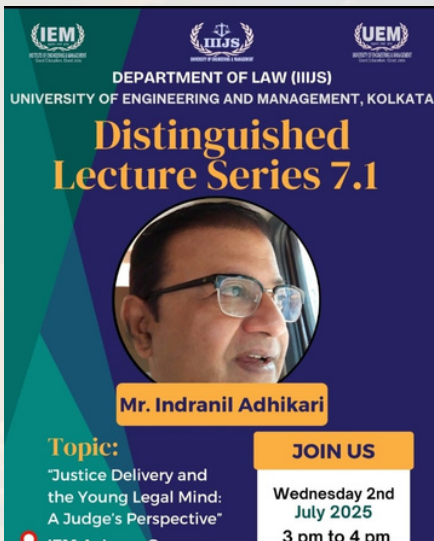
Summary of the Visit

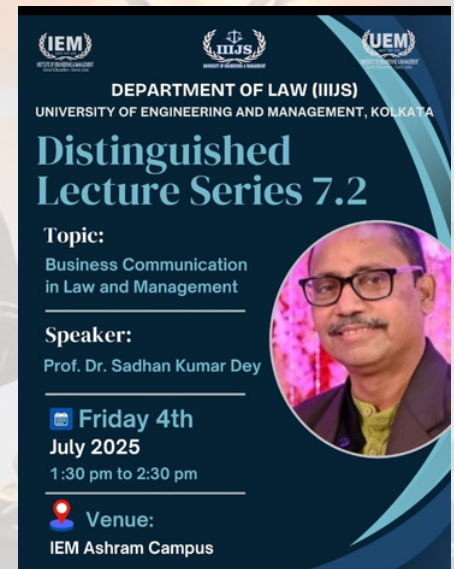


DISTINGUISHED LECTURE SERIES 7.1

On 2nd July 2025, as part of the Distinguished Lecture Series under the Induction Programme, the Department of Law hosted Mr. Indranil Adhikari, Former Judge of the City Civil Court, Kolkata. Speaking on “Justice Delivery and Young Legal Minds: A Judge’s Perspective,” he highlighted that true justice rests on fairness, integrity, impartiality, and sensitivity, extending beyond technical interpretation of law. He emphasized the dynamic nature of law, urging students to uphold constitutional morality, adaptability, and public trust in the judiciary. The session was both inspiring and insightful, reminding students of the ethical and social responsibilities of future legal professionals.

DISTINGUISHED LECTURE SERIES 7.2

The Distinguished Lecture Series 7.2 featured Dr. Sadhan Kumar Dey, who delivered an engaging talk on Business Communication and its importance in professional success. He explained communication as the foundation of clarity, trust, and alignment, introducing a creative acronym for the word COMMUNICATION as a framework for effective delivery. Dr. Dey also elaborated on the encoding–decoding process, the role of feedback, and the barriers created by “noise.” Emphasizing classrooms as training grounds, he encouraged students to practice through presentations, discussions, and simulations. The session highlighted communication as a strategic skill vital for both organizational outcomes and personal growth.



DISTINGUISHED LECTURE SERIES 7.3

The Distinguished Lecture Series 7.3 featured Dr. Arka Kumar Nag, who spoke on the role of language in the legal field, focusing on Hindi, Bengali, and English. He clarified that Hindi is not the national language but one of India’s official languages, and stressed the importance of precision in legal language for accurate application. Dr. Nag highlighted conversation and research as essential skills for lawyers, while noting that English remains the primary medium in higher judiciary and legal documentation. He emphasized that vague or incorrect use of language in law can have serious consequences, reminding students that accuracy, research, and clarity are indispensable for legal practice.
