### 1. Tragedy in the Skies: Air India Al 171 Crash Shocks the Nation Ahmedabad June 12, 2025

A nightmare unfolded just minutes after takeoff-Air India Flight Al 171, a Boeing 787 Dreamliner headed to London, crashed near Ahmedabad, killing 241 passengers and crew and 39 people on the ground. In a twist of fate, one man survived, thrown from the aircraft before impact.

Early reports point to a dual engine failure as the likely cause. Emergency response was swift, but the scale of destruction is devastating.

This is India's deadliest air disaster in 30 years, leaving the nation mourning and questions in the air.

One survivor. Hundreds of broken hearts. An investigation that must bring answers.



# 2.Operation Sindhu: India Brings Its Children Home from Iran June 18, 2025

As tensions rise in the Israel-Iran conflict, India launched Operation Sindhu to rescue its citizens. In the first phase, 110 Indian students stranded in Iran were safely flown from Yerevan to New Delhi on June 18.

The government is now preparing more evacuation flights, with over 4,000 Indians still waiting in Iran. A mission of hope, courage, and care-because no Indian is ever alone

### 3.Monsoon Magic Returns, Ending Scorching Heat! June 2025 Central india

After two long, dry weeks, the monsoon has finally returned-bringing cooling rains and big relief to millions!

Maharashtra, Gujarat, and Madhya Pradesh welcomed the showers with joy, especially farmers who depend on the rains.

Weather experts now predict above-average rainfall through the end of June.

Relief for the people, hope for the crops-monsoon is back, and India breathes easier!

#### 4. Bridge Collapse Near Pune: Lives Lost, Questions Raised Pune June 15, 2025

A 30-year-old pedestrian bridge over the Indrayani River near Pune collapsed sudderily, tuming a quiet evening into cheos.

2 people died and 32 were injured, including 6 critically.

Rescue teams rushed to the scene, while officials have launched a full investigation into the cause. An old bridge, a tragic fall-and urgent questions about safety.



#### 5.Joy turns to tragedy. Stampede at RCB Victory Parade. Bengaluru June 4th,2025

What began as a day of celebration turned into heartbreak. As RCB fans gathered to cheer their team's first-ever IPL time, a massive crowd surge outside M.Chinnaswamy Stadium led to a stampede. 11 people lost their lives and over 50 were injured

Early reports point to poor crowd control and organizer negligence FIR's have been filed as investigations begin. A moment meant for cheers ended in tears.




## 6.India on the move: New roads & trains transformed travel June 2025

# Conflict and Transformation: Navigating the Middle East's Shifting Geopolitical Landscape"

The Middle East is still a region with both deep conflict and vibrant political upheaval. Central to much tension is the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, which has been going on for decades. Gaza flare-ups in recent times have led to high casualties and repeated global demands for a two-state solution. But political disintegration within Palestinian factions and Israel's changing policies still make progress difficult.

In parallel, Iran and Israel are becoming increasingly mired in an escalating showdown. Israel's pre-emptive attacks against Iranian suspected nuclear targets, and Iran's retaliations-targeting U.S. interests in the region among others-have heightened concerns of an expanded conflict. These ceasefires brokered, though, are fragile and short-lived.

The Gulf states, Saudi Arabia, the UAE, and Qatar in particular, have moved from being oil-endowed monarchies to diplomatic players in their own right. Qatar's brokering between Israel and Iran, and Saudi Arabia's changing policy towards regional coalition-building, are examples of a new diplomacy shift towards negotiation and soft power. They are also building closer relations with world powers, balancing Western and rising new partners such as China, At the same time, public opinion throughout the Arab world is becoming increasingly outspoken, particularly with respect to Palestinian rights. This is putting pressure on governments which have normalized relations with Israel via the Abraham Accords to revisit their approaches. The United States is still a primary actor, albeit its own influence is being tested by regional actors exercising greater autonomy and by China's more subtle economic and diplomatic expansion.

In the end, the Middle East is moving through a new period. There is still conflict, but still also

transformation. The course of the region will hang on the interplay among grassroots protests, government strategies, and international diplomacy-all taking place in a context where the past is ever-visible and the future is always uncertain.
