### KEYNOTE SPEAKERS OF THE CONFERENCE



### **KEYNOTE SPEECH - 1**

Mr. Marcelo Bussacarini, Global Security Brand Strategist, CISCO, Sydney, New South Wales, Australia

The discussion by Mr. Marcelo Bussacarini provided a comprehensive analysis of the current landscape of AI adoption and cybersecurity challenges, emphasizing the staggering increase in data breaches and the substantial growth in AI technology adoption. India's leadership in AI and technology readiness was highlighted, alongside the existing gap in security readiness according to the CISCO Security Readiness Index 2024. Key challenges such as data quality, legal implications, and cultural considerations were identified, along with the dual nature of AI as both a security tool and potential cyberattack vector. Practical aspects of AI implementation, including the use of GPUs for machine learning and AI's evolving role in cyber security, were discussed. The audience was prompted to reflect on whether the world is adequately prepared for widespread AI adoption, considering ethical, legal, and societal implications. Overall, the discussion offered valuable insights into the complex relationship between AI adoption and cyber security, presenting both opportunities and challenges for the future.

#### **KEYNOTE SPEECH - 2**

## Dr. Gleuto Serafim, Director and Founder at Ixonn Group, Australia

According to Dr. Glueto Serafim, the future of ethical hacking is intertwined with the rise of artificial intelligence (AI), where ethical hackers play a vital role in addressing evolving cyber security threats. Historically, ethical hacking has evolved from phone phreaking to network hacking, highlighting its importance in modern cyber security.

Governments prioritize protecting citizen data amidst the uncertainties surrounding AI's capabilities. Ethical hackers, akin to penetration testers, are crucial for ensuring security. The field is becoming more professional, evidenced by certifications like the "CERTIFIED ETHICAL HACKER BENCHMARK."

Integration of AI and machine learning offers automation benefits but also presents challenges like sophisticated cyber threats and legal complexities. Efforts in cyber security literacy, public awareness, and policy influence are necessary to address these challenges.

Legislation and regulation play a key role, shaping the future of ethical hacking. Opportunities lie in emerging technologies and collaborative ecosystems, with innovative training methods like VR training.

In summary, the future of ethical hacking demands collective action to empower ethical hackers and safeguard digital assets against evolving cyber threats.





### **KEYNOTE SPEECH - 3**

## Mr. Sandeep Sengupta, Founder / Director – Indian School of Anti Hacking, India

Through his speech, Mr. Sengupta said that AI is transforming cyber security with cutting-edge tools to address key challenges like deep fakes, crime detection, and delayed responses. Through real-world applications like using AI for crime prevention and leveraging AI-powered threat intelligence, AI's solutions encompass advanced analysis, predictive capabilities, and behavior recognition. Challenges such as privacy concerns in smart CCTV surveillance are acknowledged, emphasizing the need for integrated solutions and continuous evolution. He advocated for a balance between artificial intelligence and human judgment, highlighting the importance of addressing societal needs without succumbing to greed.

#### KEYNOTE SPEECH - 4

Prof. (Dr.) Chandan Chakraborty, Professor, National Institute of Technical Teachers Training and Research, Kolkata

In his speech, Dr. Chakraborty discussed the integration of AI/ML in digital pathology while upholding ethical standards and highlighted their impact on India's National Education Policy (NEP) of 2020. He emphasized that AI is about solving scientific problems and noted its role in empowering educators to create and assign tasks efficiently.





#### **KEYNOTE SPEECH - 5**

Dr. Ana Penteado, Adjunct Associate Professor, Notre Dame University, Australia

In this presentation the speaker focused on Machine Learning, unsupervised learning and Self-supervised learning etc. The questions like what does AI mean for our society, its limitations and its legal boundaries were also discussed. Relationship between ethics and law was highlighted.

KEYNOTE SPEECH - 6 Prof. (Dr.) Althaf Marsoof, Associate Professor of Law, Nanyang Technological University, Singapore

In his presentation, the speaker focused on interface between AI and Inventorship. Need to recognize AI as a creative agent, preservation of human agent was discussed. A wide discussion on AI Inventor with relevant case laws and latest developments was also carried out by him. He also gave a brief introduction on Chat GPT.





### **KEYNOTE SPEECH - 7**

Prof. (Dr.) Mohuya Chakraborty, Director, Cyber-Security Centre of Excellence, UEM Kolkata

The speaker discussed about Explainable AI (XAI) and its significance in decision-making and authenticity. XAI comprises analysis, discussion, and conclusion, focusing on making AI models trustworthy through transparency and interpretability. She emphasized on the need for trustable models to avoid providing inaccurate information. The speaker also addressed the point of converting black box models into white box models by incorporating accountability, resiliency, bias mitigation, reliability, and dependency. XAI processes data to produce user-specific outcomes, considering perspectives from computer science and psychology.

#### **KEYNOTE SPEECH - 8**

Prof. (Dr.) Justin Paul, Professor, University of Puerto Rico, USA and Visiting Professor at Henley Business School, UK

Al's integration with Industry 6.0 facilitates advanced automation, predictive maintenance, and optimized production processes, enhancing efficiency and productivity. This convergence enables real-time decision-making, adaptive manufacturing, and personalized customer experiences, driving innovation and competitiveness in the industrial sector.
