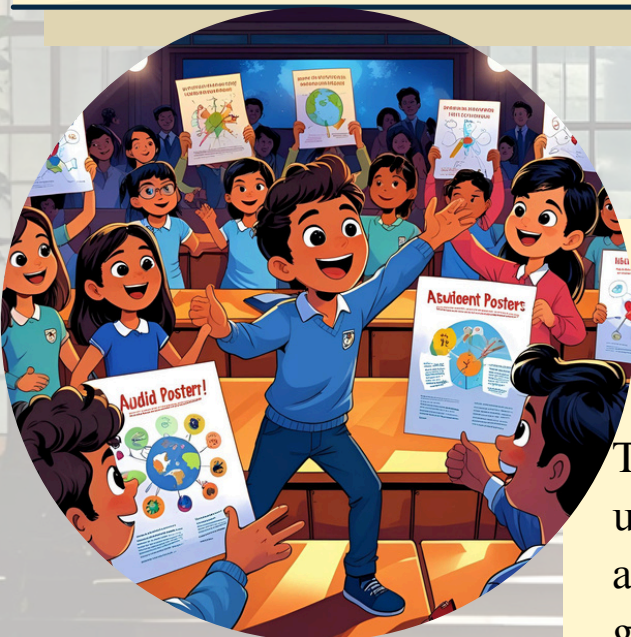


● COMMISSIONING OF INS UDAYGIRI & INS HIMGIRI

On 26 August, India simultaneously commissioned two advanced stealth frigates — INS Udaygiri and INS Himgiri— at Visakhapatnam, marking the first time two frontline surface combatants from different shipyards were inducted together.

On 20 August, the Ministry of Defence announced that the intermediate-range ballistic missile Agni-5 was test-fired from Chandipur, Odisha. The launch validated all operational and technical parameters.

They emphasized the role of legal literacy, strengthening grassroots governance, and enhancing livelihood opportunities as essential measures to curb trafficking. The lecture also underscored the importance of collaboration between law enforcement agencies, NGOs, academic institutions, and local communities.

DISTINGUISHED LECTURE SERIES 8.3

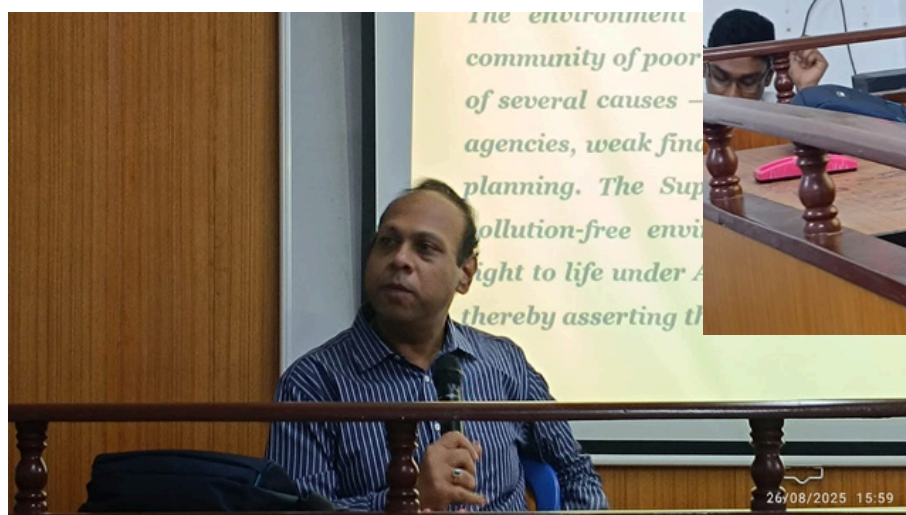

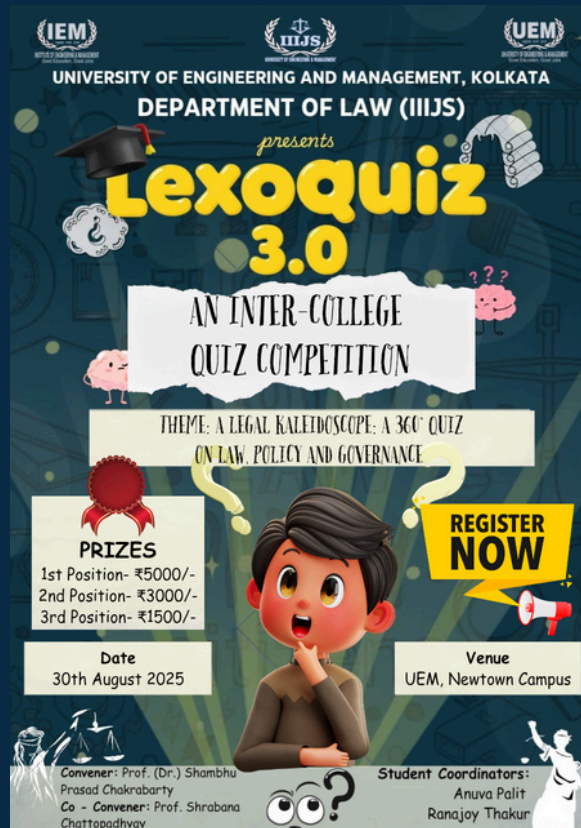
