


GST 2.0 INTRODUCED

The Indian Air Force conducted large-scale exercises from 22 to 30 September close to sensitive northern frontiers.




KOLKATA CLOUDBURST & FLOODS

CONSTITUTIONALISM AND HUMAN RIGHTS: LOOKING THROUGH THE PRISM OF SDGS FOR GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT





DATE: 22ND SEPTEMBER - 26TH SEPTEMBER, 2025

The Centre of Excellence in Sustainable Development Research (CESDR) and the Department of Law (IIIJS) at the University of Engineering & Management, Kolkata, in association with HRDC, IEM-UEM Group, hosted a 5-day Faculty Development Programme (FDP) from 22–26th September 2025 on "Constitutionalism and Human Rights: Looking through the Prism of SDGs for Global Development."

The FDP brought together some of India's most distinguished legal scholars and practitioners, offering participants a rare opportunity to explore constitutional law through contemporary lenses such as human dignity, gender justice, socio-economic rights, environmental governance, and the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs).

The inaugural session set the tone for the week-long Faculty Development Programme by

The speakers emphasized dismantling structural inequalities, advancing gender justice, reinforcing institutional integrity, and promoting peace and accountability as essential pillars of a just society. Together, their insights highlighted a unifying theme: that Transformative Constitutionalism, grounded in dignity, equality, and sustainable governance, is indispensable for shaping responsive legal education, empowering institutions, and steering global development in the SDG era.


